b. Secretary Somers requested for the rapid line and the bus to be a focus for the working group discussions.

#### **Discussion Items**

#### 1. National Environmental Policy Act - Jennifer Pyne & Allan Livingstone, ATP

- a. Jennifer Pyne, Executive Vice President of Planning, Community, and Federal Programs, and Allan Livingstone, Senior Vice President of Engineering, led a conversation on the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process including the timeline (between 18-24 months) and engagement schedule. The discussion was followed by a question-andanswer session.
  - i. Member Brooks requested to know if the process involves working and coordinating with Lady Bird Wildlife Center.
  - Member Crossley requested to know if there is ridership analysis to maximize the number of riders that can walk to any given station. This is in conjunction with his expressed desire for more stops/stations.
    - 1. Member Fan seconds the notion for more stations.

# 2. Equitable Transit Oriented Development (ETOD) Implementation Update – Warner Cook, City of Austin

- a. Warner Cook, Principal Planner for the City of Austin's Planning Department, provided an update on the ETOD implantation including recent code amendments, NLTC (North Lamar Transit Center) and SCTC (South Congress Transit Center) station area vision plans, and the current ETOD overlay. The discussion was followed by a questions-and-answer session.
  - i. Contributions to the discussion were provided by Stevie Greathouse, Planner Senior for the City of Austin's Planning Department.

# 3. History of Racism in Austin Zoning Revolving Loan Fund as Part of Solution – Cat Ridge & Bill McCamley, Transit Forward

- a. Bill McCamley, Executive Director of Transit Forward, provided a
  presentation on history of racism and zoning within Austin, TX. Cat Ridge,
  with St. Ed's University, provided a presentation on the 1957 Industrial
  Development Plan and the revolving loan fund. The presentation was
  followed by a question-and-answer session.
